

Asthma Behaviour Checklist

Below is a list of behaviours parents with asthmatic children often have to manage. For each item: (1) circle the number that best describes how much of a problem that behaviour has been for your child, and; (2) rate how confident you are in dealing with it. If that behaviour is not currently occurring, rate how confident you are that you could successfully deal with your child's behaviour if it did occur. Remember to put a confidence rating for every item.

Rate your confidence from 1 (Certain I can't do it) to 10 (Certain I can do it).
