

Scoring Key for the Child Self-Regulation Scales (CSRS)

All 19 items are rated on a scale of 0 to 7. Items no. 1 and 18 are reversed items, so the scoring needs to be reversed (i.e., 1 = 7, 2 = 6, 3 = 5, 4 = 4, 5 = 3, 6 = 2, 7 = 1) before summing the total score for each subscale.

Please refer to the table below for additional information on coding the items. Scoring can be in total or per domain. The total score represents perceived child self-regulation capability, ranging from 19 to 133; the higher scores indicate better child self-regulation.

Scale	Items	Interpretation	Possible Range
Self- Management	10, 15, 16, 18, 19	Higher scores indicate higher level of self-management	5 – 35
Self-Sufficiency	4, 6, 9, 13	Higher scores indicate higher level of self-sufficiency	4 – 28
Self-Efficacy	2, 3, 11	Higher scores indicate higher level of self-efficacy	3 – 21
Personal Agency	1, 8, 17	Higher scores indicate higher level of personal agency	3 – 21
Problem Solving	5, 7, 12, 14	Higher scores indicate higher level of problem solving	4 - 28
